Biographical or Historical Information

Gerald Bernstein (1935?-2006) was a lifelong student of American Art and modern architecture. Bernstein was Professor of Fine Arts at Brandeis from 1967-2000, where he taught predominantly taught architectural history. He began teaching at Brandeis in 1967, where he organized classes and research into modern architecture, including the annual Brandeis Architecture Symposium. Through the course of his life, he studied American Art and modern architecture. A very popular teacher, he received numerous teaching awards during his career at Brandeis. He edited the most important book to date on Brandeis University architecture called *Building a Campus: An Architectural Celebration of Brandeis University's 50th Anniversary*.
